

Rent consultation for 2026

Council housing services are funded by tenants' rents in a dedicated budget called the Housing Revenue Account (HRA). Council tax or other general funding at the Council cannot be used for council housing maintenance only the HRA.

From April 2026, council rents will go up by the rate of inflation (CPI) plus 1%. This follows the Government's rules for social housing rents and helps us keep homes maintained and services running.



This would mean...

The increase would see a typical three-bedroom household pay an extra £5 a week, or £260 a year in rent.



The Government also has a policy called 'rent convergence' that aims to make rents fair and consistent across similar council homes. This could mean that some tenants whose rent is currently much lower than others for similar homes may see an extra increase in the future. This is still being looked at, and no decision has been made yet.

Any increase in rent would be used to help maintain and improve homes across Cornwall

When setting the council housing budget, the Council needs to balance the need for:



Council housing services 'revenue' - money to deliver your housing services – including repairs



Council housing 'capital' - building work to improve the condition of your homes



Creating new/more homes

Why do rents need to go up?



Without a rent increase, inflation - the rising cost of everyday goods and services - will leave the Council and Cornwall Housing with less money to provide services. Cornwall Council rents are already low compared to many other councils and housing associations. At the same time, many homes need repairs and improvements, including a major maintenance programme.
